September 7, 2023

The meeting opened at 7:40 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Thirty-One members were present (including officers).

OFFICERS' REPORTS

The 2023 BFCU Car Show took place on July 9. There was a brief downpour during the show, but most cars stayed until the skies cleared. We had five sponsors: AutoQuip (Platinum), WheelCraft (Platinum), Elite Performance & Repair (Gold), The Fidge Factor (Gold) and Bolla Oil (Gold). We had four food vendors and six non-food vendors. One Hundred and eight cars were judged, and another nine cars paid to enter. Seventy plaques and trophies were awarded. **Mark Feldman** secured a bagel maker who furnished bagels for LIV workers before the show. Judging fees for LIV members working the show and entering their cars were waived. We used a generator to power our PA system. There are outdoor electrical outlets available at the BFCU site, but they are not located in areas which would make their use practical for us. As usual LIV members came out in force and worked hard to put the show on. Thank you to all LIV members who worked at the show. LIV members worked on Registration, Parking, Tabulation, Judging, LIV Booth/Merchandise Sales, 50/50 Raffle Ticket Sales and Clean-Up.

Joe Balabanick was happy to report that our charity, Last hope Animal Rescue and Rehabilitation, collected just under \$2,500.00.


