



# LIV Meeting Minutes

## September 4, 2025

The meeting was called to order by President John Albora, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. New member Delano Brown has a C8 Corvette and Manny (Last name) has a C4.

Tonight, we had a slide presentation on the Phantom Corsair by Dr. Meredith Jaffe. It was an unusual car built 1938-1939 and the only one ever built. It was unusual that it had seating for four people in the front seat, and the driver sat in one position in from the left-hand door. It was very wide! The designer died just after the first car was built. It was, however, in a movie in 1940, though it was called the Wombat in the movie. The car now resides in an automotive museum in Reno, Nevada.

Dr. Jaffe is quite a car enthusiast and is knowledgeable about many different cars that have been produced, and she and her husband own several unusual cars. She has authored a book about the Phantom Corsair which was recently published.

#### **Island Harvest Harvesting Event**
