OFFICER'S REPORTS

President - Steve Daidone - not in attendance as mentioned above.

Vice President - Mike Comparetto - Mike, reviewed the following items:

- 1) He mentioned that we could have a club event at the Malibu Beach Club in Lido Beach in May/2017 that could be a low cost show and good opportunity for the club to generate additional funds. It was also mentioned that a photo shoot could also be included to create interest for club members and non-members, as well. More details and discussion to follow.
- 2) Mike also informed the group that The Last Hope Animal Rescue and Rehabilitation would be having their 35th annual dinner on October 27th at the Coral House in Baldwin. This year they will be honoring Joe Greco, our LIV member, for his past efforts and contributions in support of the Last Hope organization. The cost will be \$85 per person and anyone who is interested should inform the BOD by October 12th. Approximately 15 members expressed their potential interest to attend.
- 3) Mike reviewed the club's participation in the Corvettes at Carlisle event in Pennsylvania. Although members still desire to attend this event, it was agreed that there were less cars, less vendor participation and overall appeared to be

a quiet showing of people.

- 4) LIV Picnic - it was discussed that there was a low turnout and it appears that this event was losing support.
- 5) Riverhead Raceway event - during previous meetings, it appeared that this event had interest; however, in actuality on the day of the event, it had a poor turnout and support.
- 6) Mike discussed that the Mangano show will be coming up on the weekend of September 24th and 25th. He restated that this is the year of the Corvette and said that he was requesting volunteers to help support and assist in the overall show. He also mentioned that the corvettes will be parking on the asphalt instead of the grass/unpaved area which might be more suitable for club attendees.
- 7) Mark Tully informed the group that the North Fork Wine Cruise event would be held on November 6th and requested that this event be published and promoted in the monthly club newsletter. Mike had expressed that he would talk to Steve D.
- 8) Mike reviewed the planning process for the 2017 Valentine's Day Brunch. It will cost \$35 per person and would require a 25/30-person guarantee. The 5th and 19th of February are available and a club decision should be made at the upcoming meetings.
- 9) Mike also reviewed the possibility of sending out the monthly minutes via email. He took questions on interest and feasibility. More to follow.

Treasurer - Tony Sorrentino - Tony reviewed the current financial status for the month of August period. The opening August 1st balance was \$11,765. Cash deposits from membership fees, 50/50, and petty cash less current monthly expenses brought the new monthly ending balance to \$12,059.
